Section 20-4 fourth paragraph (Regulations pursuant to the Education Act) lists the information parents shall have. Please note that after the pupil has turned 18 years of age, the school can no longer give this information to parents. **Pupils over 18 years of age can consent to their parents being given continued access to this information.**

### **Section 20-4 Cooperation with parents with children in upper-secondary education (Regulations pursuant to the Education Act)**

The school shall have contact throughout the entire school year with the parents of pupils under the age of majority pursuant to section 1 of the Guardianship Act. At the start of the school year in Vg1 and Vg2 the school shall hold a parents' meeting to inform them about the school, the content of the teaching, how they can cooperate with the school, school procedures and other relevant information. During the first half of the school year, parents of pupils below the age of majority who are in Vg1 or Vg2 are entitled to at least one planned and structured dialogue with the form teacher about how the pupil works on a daily basis and about the pupil's competence in the subject. In addition, the form teacher shall have a dialogue with the parents about the pupil's development pursuant to section 1-1 of the Education Act, core curriculum and principles for the education. The dialogue shall clarify how the pupil, the school and the parents shall cooperate for the best learning and development of the pupil. The pupil has the right to be present during the dialogue with his/her parents. This dialogue may draw on aspects from the teach-pupil dialogue pursuant to section 3-11 third paragraph and the half-term assessment in the subject pursuant to section 3-13. Parents of pupils under the age of majority shall receive in writing or verbally:

- a) notification of the pupil's absenteeism
- b) notification if the pupil is at risk of not having the grounds for assessment in the subject, in behaviour or in conduct or that the pupil is at risk of getting the grade fair or poor in behaviour or conduct, jf. section 3-7
- c) information about the pupil's and parents' rights pursuant to the Education Act and Regulations
- d) other important information about the pupil, unless this is subject to obligations of confidentiality pursuant to other legislation.
